# II. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Harrall noted that "federally" was misspelled on page 5. Haga also stated that he was not listed as either absent or present but did attend the meeting.

Schweitzer entertained a motion to approve the April 15, 2020 joint Technical/Policy Committee minutes.

MOTION by Naramore, SUPPORT by Becker, to approve the April 15, 2020 joint Technical/Policy Committee minutes as corrected. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY by roll call vote.

# III. OPPORTUNITY FOR PUBLIC COMMENT

None

#### IV. TIP AMENDMENTS

**Referring to Item IV: Attachment A,** Joseph introduced the TIP amendments that were being requested, which are as follows:

- Hope Network and Kent County Community Action have received their allocation of Section 5310 funding for FY2020 and are, therefore, requesting to add transit capital projects to the TIP. These additions have triggered a GPA threshold increase that needs to be reviewed and approved.
- Grand Rapids and Rockford have both been awarded local safety funds from the statewide pool for safety projects in FY2021. Adding these projects to the FY2021 Local Traffic Operations and Safety GPA has triggered a GPA threshold increase that needs to be reviewed and approved.
- Grand Rapids is also requesting to amend a FY2021 reconstruction project, slightly
  modifying the limits and adding a significant amount of local funds. The federal
  funding level for this project will not change.

Additional information was provided in the agenda packet.

Additionally, Joseph explained that the KCRC has a 2021 project that was programmed incorrectly in the TIP for 2020. This triggered a GPA threshold issue for the 2021 sustainability GPA, and therefore a technical correction is needed.

Harrall added that this project was a TAP project, Burton St. nonmororized trail over 96, and asked that the project be documented in the motion.

Schweitzer entertained a motion to approve the TIP amendments, as requested.

MOTION by Naramore, SUPPORT by Haagsma, to approve the TIP amendments requested by Hope Network, Kent County Community Action, the City of Grand

Rapids, the City of Rockford, as well as the technical correction to the 2021 sustainability GPA for the KCRC's Burton St. nonmotorized trail over 96 project. MOTION CARRIED UNANIMOUSLY by roll call vote.

### V. OTHER BUSINESS

Due to Schweitzer having issues with an audio connection, Laughlin, Technical Committee chair, assumed chairmanship of the meeting from this point forward.

Joseph stated that the Michigan division of FHWA has been discussing internally what qualifies as a federal amendment. Currently, budget changes of 20% or more of the total project cost trigger a federal amendment, which means that these amendments must be reviewed by FHWA, even if only local dollars are increasing. FHWA has developed a white paper which discusses federal cost changes of 25% or greater triggering a federal amendment. In the past, only federal cost changes triggered an amendment. FHWA is asking for feedback on this topic by the end of June. Joseph stated that she would follow up this discussion item with an email as well as a survey to garner member feedback. Joseph encouraged the committee to consider what the public wants to know versus reducing the number of amendments when responding.

Dennis Kent noted that limiting the number of federal amendments doesn't mean that all amendments won't still go through the MPO Committee process for review. Changing what triggers an amendment will only limit the amendments that go to FHWA.

Tyler Kent introduced MDOT Grand Region's planning/engineering intern, Brenden Eatmon, who will be attending our meetings with Dennis and Tyler Kent for the foreseeable future.

Dennis Kent explained that MDOT is participating in a one day a week furlough through the end of July. LAP has sent out a schedule of the furlough days, most of which fall on either side of a weekend.

Weiss asked Dennis Kent to discuss MDOT's recent traffic reports that showed significantly decreased traffic volumes. Kent explained that traffic volumes statewide are down. At one point, reports, most of which are primarily focused on the freeway system, showed that traffic volumes were reduced by as much as 60%. As Michigan gradually reopens, traffic volumes are slowly increasing. The last report Kent had viewed showed that traffic volumes were down in the 30% range. Reduced traffic volumes will impact revenue, as the gas tax funds transit, road projects, the TAP program, etc. According to a recent statewide revenue estimating conference, the general fund is down significantly, but Kent has not seen any numbers yet that show the impact the Stay at Home Order will have on the federal or state transportation trust fund.

Weiss added that, after the quarantine, the numbers he saw showed that traffic dropped over 60% for a couple of weeks, then went up to a 40% decline and stabilized there for a while, and traffic is now gradually increasing again. Discussion ensued. Kent reaffirmed that we haven't seen new gas tax revenue projections based on reduced traffic volumes. Kent added that funding is also received from income taxes from the

general fund through the 2015 transportation package, so there may be future changes there as well.

Haagsma stated that the KCRC has a chart that he will send to GVMC staff for distribution indicating that traffic volumes are down 24% at 8 locations they are tracking from pre-COVID times. Their data shows that traffic is ticking back up too.

Tyler Kent added that according to the Mackinac bridge authority, traffic is steadily increasing across the bridge, and they will need to hire for the fall boost.

Discussion ensued.

RE: FY2020-2023 Transportation Improvement Program

On behalf of Grand Rapids, and MDOT, the following amendments/modifications to the FY2020-2023 TIP are being requested. Here are the specific requests:

- Grand Rapids is requesting to change the work type of a FY2021 project from a
  reconstruct to a resurfacing, which lowered the total and local portions of the
  budget. The federal funding amount did not change. Grand Rapids also
  increased the local participating costs on a second FY2021 project, which also
  changed the non-participating amount (see attachment).
- MDOT is requesting the amendments/modifications to the TIP project list in the attached TIP Amendments/Modifications Summary. These include phase budget changes, phase additions, and construction length changes. Some of these changes have triggered GPA threshold increases. These increase requests are also attached for Committee review.

**RE:** Administrative Modification to FY2021 UPWP

MDOT has recently awarded GVMC \$25,000 in State Planning & Research funds for GVMC's work on the US-131/I-96 Corridor Study in FY2021. While this funding was not identified originally in the FY2021 UPWP, the work associated with this task had been included in the document.

Because the amount of additional funding is minor compared to the overall Federal Approved FY2021 UPWP value of \$1,786,430 and because the task description for the study remains unchanged, MDOT is considering this an administrative modification to the FY2021 UPWP. MDOT has approved the modification and submitted letters to our federal partners notifying them of the change.
